



## This is the perfect place to come for the blues.

The Blue Grotto is an enchanting cavern carved by the sea in the rugged fjord-like coastline, named for the astonishingly vivid turquoise waters that surround it, and accessible only in the small Luzzu boats - painted in traditional blue, red and yellow. Fifteen miles to the north lies the Blue Lagoon, where yachts come to weigh anchor in the crystal-clear water, where snorkellers can see straight down to the white sand bed below, and even the youngest swimmers can paddle in the gentle shallows. Further north still, you can walk over ancient fossils on the cliff side to gaze out at the Azure Window, a spectacular natural stone arch some 20 metres high which juts out from the land over the sea. The natural breeze is warmed by the sun and carries the tang of salt, while far below you can see divers surfacing from the blue depths. And if you love blues music, try to catch the singing of I-ghana, centuries-old local songs which express the melancholy of unrequited love. **WHERE IS THIS PLACE?**
